

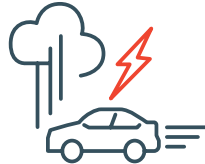
# COMMUNITY ATTITUDES TO ROAD SAFETY 2021

Road Safety Attitudinal Tracking Research 2021

UNPROMPTED, ROAD USERS CONSIDERED THESE THE BIGGEST SINGLE CAUSE OF CRASHES.



Almost  
**1 in 2**  
Identified that lack of attention/mobile phone use is the biggest cause of serious casualties.



**25%**  
Identified speeding, including speeding when the conditions is the biggest cause of serious casualties.



**3%**  
Identified that drink driving is the biggest cause of serious casualties.

WHEN ASKED TO RANK THE RISKIEST BEHAVIOURS ON OUR ROADS.



**90%**  
Considered sending a text while driving is the first or second most risky behaviour on our roads.



**65%**  
Considered driving a bit over the 0.05 alcohol limit while driving is the first or second most risky behaviour on our roads.



**29%**  
Considered driving when tired while driving is the first or second most risky behaviour on our roads.



**14%**  
Considered driving up to 10 km/h over the speed limit while driving is the first or second most risky behaviour on our roads.

FATAL FIVE CONTRIBUTORS TO SERIOUS CASUALTY CRASHES OVER THE PAST 10 YEARS.



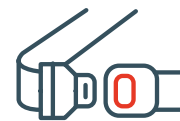
