The initial list of Safety Performance Indicators (SPIs) being monitored by the Tasmanian Government is presented below. SPIs will help monitor the performance of the government's actions taken under the *Towards Zero* – *Tasmanian Road Safety Strategy 2017-2026*, and *Towards Zero Action Plan 2020-2026* (Action Plan).

SPIs included in the Action Plan were selected to inform understanding of road safety in Tasmania, to help support achieving actions and outcomes proposed in the Action Plan. This has required the development of analysis methodologies, and for data to be sourced. This process is in progress with work on-going across SPIs.

Some SPIs have an initial baseline established (listed in the table below). Where data is currently unavailable for reporting an 'N/A' (not available) is denoted against relevant SPIs.
