Since 2014, more than **3,000 people** have been seriously injured **or killed** on Tasmanian roads



Vehicle speed is a leading contributor to people being killed and seriously injured



More than 60% of serious crashes occur on 80+ km/h roads, while 30% occur on 50-60 km/h roads
